The College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador (CLPNNL) is in the process of revising its Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) Competency Profile document. You are invited to provide input into the draft revised document.

The draft Competency Profile document, once completed and approved by the CLPNNL Board, is intended to replace the CLPNNL's 2011 *Competency Profile for Licensed Practical Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador*. For your reference, the current document is linked [here](#).

The purpose of the competency profile is to articulate the skills that are approved by CLPNNL to be within the scope of practice for the LPN profession in Newfoundland and Labrador. It is used by LPNs, educators, employers, members of the public and other stakeholders to identify activities that LPNs are, or can be, educated and authorized to perform.

Please review the draft document before moving on to complete the survey. We suggest you review the introduction prior to reviewing the competency statements. Links to the draft document (in sections) are included below.
